## **FOOD ALLERGY AWARENESS**

Nobody knows precisely what causes food allergies. A combination of genes – allergies run in families – and environment clearly plays a role. Food allergies can appear at any time and very suddenly, and they can often be life threatening.

One of the challenges families face is that many people don't really understand food allergies. According to a report by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and The Food Allergy & Anaphylaxis Network (FAAN):

- An estimated 3 million children have a food allergy
- One in every 17 children under the age of 3 has a food allergy
- Peanut allergy doubled in children over a 5-year period (1997-2002)
- Even trace amounts of a food allergen can cause a reaction

## What is the difference between a food allergy and a food intolerance?

People often confuse food allergies with food intolerance. There is a difference. Someone with an allergy must avoid the food allergen whereas someone with a food intolerance may be able to eat small quantities of the food without a problem.

## **Food allergies:**

- Are caused by the immune system when the body mistakenly identifies a food or a component of a food as a harmful substance and causes a person's own antibodies to attack.
- > Start a reaction of chemical changes that causes swelling and irritation in the body.
- Cause symptoms that may include tingling in the mouth, hives, swelling in the lips, or difficulty breathing.

## **Food intolerances:**

- Cause problems without involving the immune system.
- Can take hours, days, or sometimes weeks to manifest as problems/discomfort.
- Cause a person's body to have problems digesting certain foods, causing symptoms that may include abdominal cramps, bloating, or diarrhea.

Remember that any food can cause a food allergy so it is important to be aware of the signs and symptoms of food allergies. There are, however, certain foods that are more likely to cause an allergic reaction. In particular, parents should be aware of the eight most common foods that can cause an allergic reaction.

The eight (8) most common foods that can cause allergic reactions include:

- Milk (dairy)
- ➤ Eggs
- Peanuts
- Soybeans
- Wheat
- Nut from trees (such as walnuts, pistachios, pecans, and almonds)
- Fish (such as salmon and tuna)
- > Shellfish (such as shrimp, crab, and lobster)

If you suspect that you or your child may have food allergies or intolerances, find a specialist who can help you identify which foods you or your child has issues with. If you find that you or your child has a true food allergy, it is important to develop a food allergy action plan. ## CANCER SCREENINGS – EARLY DETECTION SAVES LIVES

Early detection of cancer makes healing faster and overall success rates much higher. This is especially true with a cancer diagnosis.

With advanced technology and mammogram screenings, more women are able to detect breast cancer at an early state. Most women diagnosed with breast cancer today successfully complete treatment and go on to live healthy lives. Breast self-exams are also important because you may be first to notice changes in your body.

It's all about early detection when the condition is easiest to treat. The same holds true for prostate and lung cancers. Some cancers can actually be prevented through screening. Colon, skin, and cervical cancers are among this group. Screenings help to identify abnormal cells before they have a chance to become cancer.

Once you reach the age of 40, an annual physical exam becomes a way to monitor your health. Schedule the following preventive screenings to help keep you feeling your best:

## Mammogram

Every year beginning at age 40.

## **Pap Test**

Every 1-2 years starting at age 21; and younger if sexually active. At age 30, a pap test is recommended every 2-3 years; sooner if you have an abnormal ready.

#### **Colorectal Cancer**

First screening at age 50.

## **Prostate Screening**

At age 50 talk to your doctor about screening.

These recommendations are for people with average risk – people with a family history of these diseases or other risk factors should talk to their doctor about the best screening schedule for them.
